Ask Household Member or Applicant to Certify That She's Pregnant

HUD says that you must not require an applicant or member to get written verification of her pregnancy from her doctor. However, when you learn that an applicant or resident is pregnant, you may ask her to sign a document certifying her condition for the household file.
